#### United Way and FamilyWize

It's easy to use a FamilyWize Card. There are no forms to fill out, waiting period or registration. The card is really just like a reusable prescription coupon on all FDA approved medicines. Anyone in your family, your work, your church or your neighborhood can use it immediately. You can even use it if you have health insurance, both during deductible periods and for anything your insurance does not pay for.

Designed to reduce the cost of prescriptions, the free FamilyWize prescription drug savings card is available at the United Way of Moore County and many of our partner agencies. Total savings in Moore County last year were \$258,730. Please remember to thank your pharmacy for its participation in the FamilyWize network and for the important and positive difference they are making for you, your family and your community.

All funding for the FamilyWize program is provided by part of the dispensing fee that is included in the cost of medicines when a FamilyWize card is used to save you money.





#### Help starts here.

Since February 11, 2009 the United Way of Moore County has provided the 2-1-1 Information & Referral system to our community.

Moore County residents can receive one-on-one service 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The system also provides callers with multilingual service if needed.


The 2-1-1 Information and Referral line kicked off six years ago in Moore County. By December 31, 2014, 3,599 calls had been made to the system resulting in 3,539 referrals for services in our community.

In 2014, the Moore County 2-1-1 Information and Referral line received 559 calls resulting in 718 referrals to service. Based on calls to the system, the top four needs in the community were:

- 1. Utility service payment assistance
- 2. Food pantries
- 3. Homeless Shelter
- 4. Rent Payment Assistance
