

Impact

3,540 children and youth participated in opportunities to start school ready to learn, are proficient at reading, stay on track in middle school, or earned a high school diploma to pursue higher education.

Thriving communities exist where families are making ends meet and fulfilling their potential.

19,102 meals were served assisting elderly, temporarily disabled, and disabled residents in our community.

Access to healthcare & creating opportunities for better health are among our top priorities.

86 families avoided homelessness and 29 families received food, clothing, and shelter after losing everything in a fire.

4,934 families were helped to get back on stable financial ground.

238 children received a new pair of athletic shoes, some for the first time.



Focus

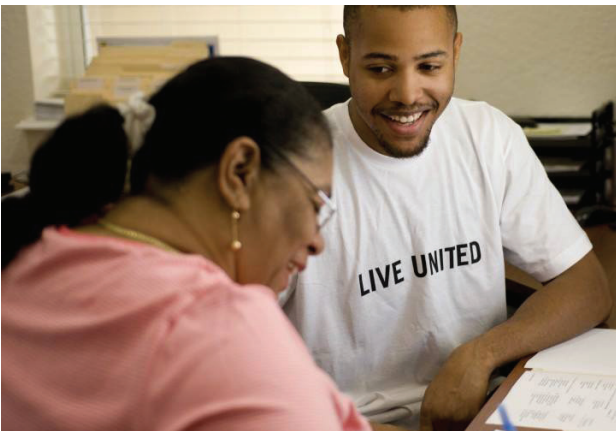


Education:
