Focus



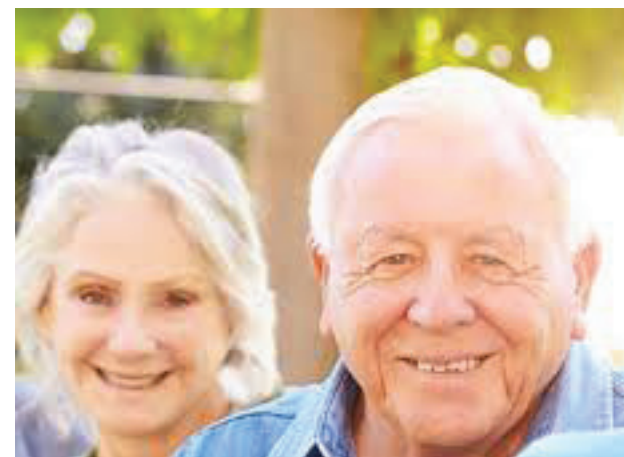
Education:
